We're writing to let you know that your plan sponsor, HEWLETT-PACKARD, has decided to end your prescription drug coverage. UnitedHealthcare MedicareRx for Groups (PDP) will end 12-31-2014. Beginning 01-01-2015, the plan won't cover any prescription drugs you get filled.

What if I want prescription drug coverage?

If you are already enrolled in Original Medicare (Medicare Part A and Part B), you can buy Medicare Part D Prescription Drug coverage on your own. There may be plans similar to your current coverage. Note: you may have to pay a premium (monthly payment) for some of these plans.

Please talk to HEWLETT-PACKARD before you sign up for any new coverage.

See if you have other choices for coverage. Buying a new plan may affect any coverage your plan sponsor offers now. It could also affect future coverage. So, be sure to get all the facts before you take action.

How do I choose new Medicare Part D prescription drug coverage?

After you check with HEWLETT-PACKARD, there are several factors to consider. Ask yourself, does the plan:

- Fit my budget?
- Cover my prescriptions?
- Have network pharmacies in my area?

We hope you will consider a UnitedHealthcare® individual plan.

When do I need to sign up for new Medicare Part D prescription drug coverage?

In general, Medicare limits when you can join a new Medicare Prescription Drug plan.

However, you are losing your current prescription drug coverage because HEWLETT-PACKARD is ending it. So, you have a two (2) month Special Enrollment Period (SEP) to join a Medicare plan. The SEP begins 01-01-2015.

Medicare also has rules about **when** to get prescription drug coverage. You need to sign up for Medicare Prescription Drug coverage as soon as you qualify. And, make sure that coverage is:

- A Medicare Prescription Drug plan, or
- Other Prescription Drug coverage that met Medicare's minimum standards. This is called creditable coverage

You also need to make sure you don't have a break in that creditable coverage lasting 63 or more days. If you don't, you may have to pay a Late Enrollment Penalty if you sign up for Medicare Prescription Drug coverage in the future.

To avoid a break in coverage, don't wait. Be sure to make your choice and sign up early.

If you believe the information in this letter is wrong, please talk to your plan sponsor. You also have the right to ask for a review by the plan. For more information look to the chapter on coverage decisions, appeals, complaints in your Evidence of Coverage.
